The CATCH Provider Survey Report

CATCH aims at promoting coastal angling tourism in the South Baltic Region by providing coastal communities with tools and guidelines for sustainable activities and by establishing a crossborder information and knowledge platform.

In order to provide coastal angling businesses with these guidelines, current activities in the South Baltic Region needed to be analysed, shortcomings identified and best practices for a future development defined.

- Survey of coastal angling service providers in the case study areas of CATCH
- 7 provider categories: boat rentals, cutter operators, accommodation services, angling guides, angling shops, license management, associations
- Considered information: details on service offers, communication strategies, cooperation, sustainability activities

Contents & Findings of the Report

Distribution of coastal angling service providers

- Distribution of coastal angling service providers differs, in part, greatly among partner countries
- Infrastructure, networks and concepts differ widely, even within the same country



Shortcomings

Four main issues were identified on a cross-border level

- Language barriers
- Online visibility
- Sustainability considerations
- Networks and cooperation
