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Foreword of the Provincial Governors

More than a century ago, the border area between Austria and Italy was one of the sites of World War I. Today, we view the Alpine region as a dynamic habitat and economic area straddling Europe's great cultural regions.

In order to intensify the cross-border cooperation between Italy and Austria, two European Groupings for Territorial Cooperation (EGTC) were set up in 2011 and 2012 – the European Region Tyrol – South Tyrol - Trentino and the Euregio Senza Confini (including the states of Carinthia, Friuli Venezia Giulia, and Veneto). On the basis of the European statutory regulations, it was possible for the first time for the regions to establish their cooperation on a legally firm foundation.

Starting in 2016, the project Fit for Cooperation – Fit4Co – was elaborated as the foundation for closer, project-oriented cooperation between the two EGTCs. On the basis of this first joint project of the two EGTC, the political and legal prerequisites for stronger cross-border cooperation were to be created and the institutional resources of public administration organizations strengthened.

As the current situation caused by Covid-19 has made clear to us, numerous different challenges and threats don't stop at national borders. In order to meet these challenges, we need strong cross-border cooperation between the regions. Fit4Co provides the prerequisites for this.

The goal of Fit4Co is to make our European regions more felt and impactful for citizens by means of joint projects. Projects range from improved protection of the populace against heavy rainfall and catastrophes to the creation of foundations for joint spatial planning along the Brenner axis and all the way up to improving tourist

options in the Interreg program area of Italy-Austria. But besides the projects themselves, we are also expanding sustainable networks between our administrative organizations which will prove advantageous in the future.

Thus, we view the "Fit for Cooperation" project as an investment in the future of all of the citizens of our six states. The Fit4Co Project Tandems are so to speak the pioneers for a new kind of cross-border cooperation. On the basis of this, we want to continue intensifying the cooperation between our Euregios – with the goal of assuming the role of a vanguard in helping the regions of Europe to grow together.

The provincial / regional governors of the Fit4Co regions are encouraged by the accomplishments already achieved and are confident that this joint pilot project will deliver long-term added value in the future.

Fit4Co - An interim report

"Whoever wants to cooperate will find a way. Whoever doesn't want to cooperate will find an excuse."

"Fit for Cooperation (Fit4Co)" is a unique program in two ways. Firstly, a systematic approach to developing cross-border projects in a multi-level government framework was developed. Secondly, it represents the first joint initiative of the two European regions at the Austrian-Italian border.

When it was launched in 2016, the proponents of "Fit4Co" were well aware that they were venturing into a new frontier with this cross-border project. That's why the regional coordination units of the Italy-Austria INTERREG-Program were included in the development process from the very beginning. Their feedback formed an essential basis for elaborating the "Fit4Co" project.

The thorough groundwork done for "Fit4Co," the commitment of policy-makers, and the stringent implementation by the project team were the main factors for the implementation of this program. On the basis of the communications and cooperation structures, it has been possible – even during the "lockdown" – to continue the work in the cooperation tandems and between the two Euroregions.

The goal of the "Fit4Co" program was to accompany a series of projects in the project planning phase. From the project idea all the way up to the finished project plan – which must be both ready and suitable for implementation.

We are very happy to be able to report that this five-phase process has been embraced and carried out by most of the tandems. For example, in the European Region Tyrol – South Tyrol – Trentino, 18 project tandems were initiated to this one-year process at the kick-off meeting in Toblach (South Tyrol); and 14 tandems managed to reach the final stage, taking place in Stams Abbey in Tyrol on October 1, 2020.

In the Euregio Senza Confini, 12 project tandems were launched and will continue working on the development of their projects into the first half of 2021.

In the next phase, "Fit4Co" will focus on the evaluation of the experience gained by the project tandems and their project coaches in the one-year project planning phase, on the systematic identification of barriers in cross-border cooperation, and on accompanying those projects most suitable for implementation in the transition phase to project implementation.

With "Fit4Co," the cooperation between the two Euroregions as well as the cooperation of each Euroregion with local and regional entities has achieved a new quality. We would like to thank all of the project coordinators, project team members, and project coaches for their commitment and many exciting meetings. We would also like to wish all project tandems the greatest success in the implementation of their projects, and can firmly voice our assurance that our Euroregions will be available to handle any questions and provide support in this phase, too.

We are especially grateful to the INTERREG Councils of the CLLD regions of "Dolomiti live" and the Wipptal / Alta Valle Isarco, who have submitted their own projects for inclusion in Fit4Co. Together, we have thus attained a new level of successful cooperation in a multi-level governmental system in the Euroregion.

As Euroregions in the border area between Austria and Italy, we will continue to work together to overcome legal, political, and organizational barriers to cross-border cooperation.

1. Project description of Fit4Co

1.1. Fit4Co - The Euregio start-up package for project development

The Fit for Cooperation (Fit4Co) project is a joint project of two Euroregions: The European Region Tyrol – South Tyrol – Trentino and the Euregio of Senza Confini (comprised of Carinthia, Veneto, and Friuli Venezia Giulia). It is the first project of two EGTCs in the Italy-Austria Interreg program area and one of the first joint projects of two EGTCs in Europe at all.

These two Euregios were formed in 2011 and 2012 as European Groupings for Territorial Cooperation (EGTC) for the purpose of deepening cross-border cooperation to promote governance in the multi-level system.

The goal of Fit4Co is to merge the administrative forms in the public area in the states/provinces of the participating Euroregions and, by means of concrete projects, to achieve their synthesis. Cross-border cooperation is exciting, but also difficult. Different languages, administrative cultures, and legal system represent barriers that make transfrontier projects challenging. To ensure their success, we need techniques and skills permitting transfrontier projects to be implemented in the interest of citizens. In the case of Fit4Co, the goal is to search for and promote commonalities in the complexity of the various different functional methods.

The central challenge is to promote the awareness of the public administrative organizations – the system partners for cross-border cooperation – and to accompany them during their first steps in cooperation projects. The common goal of Fit4Co is to support public administration organizations in project planning, which is the cornerstone of project management.



The Euregio Program supports administrative organizations, in the context of workshops, to elaborate transfrontier projects with the help of experts. This is down in the framework of cooperation tandems. A cooperation tandem is composed of two or more administrative partners from the program area (Tyrol, South Tyrol, Trentino, Carinthia, Friuli Venezia Giulia, Veneto, Salzburg), with at least one Austrian and one Italian partner. In summary, we can regard Fit4Co as a blacksmith for forging transfrontier projects.

Preparation and foundations of the project

In order to obtain an overview of the existent positive examples of cross-border cooperation in the project area and to isolate the ingredients necessary for their success, a preparatory scientific study was commissioned to provide a starting-point for Fit4Co.

In doing this, the two Euregios decided at the kick-off event in Trieste which model projects for cross-border cooperation should serve as a starting-point for the EURAC study.

On this basis, researchers at EURAC's Institute for Minority Rights produced a high-quality "Analysis of success factors for cross-border cooperation."

This analysis served as a design basis.

Additionally, a "Project Sketch – Descriptive Guideline for Elaborating and Designing Projects" was prepared. In essence, this represented a summary of all the steps necessary for the successful completion of a transfrontier project.

In the area of project structure and communication, the European Region commissioned the communications company clavis G.m.b.H. with the elaboration of feasible procedures for Fit4Co. This led not only to the communication strategy, but also the to the tandem system. These preparatory steps were necessary to provide this exciting project with the professional basis it needed.

Encouraging participation: The Fit4Co communication campaign

Especially in the case of pilot projects, communication is often revealed to be a big challenge. The awareness campaign which clavis developed targets three groups needed for success in the advertisement phase. These groups include potential participants, political representatives, and multipliers in leadership positions acting as independent communicators. The goal of this large-scale campaign was to motivate people to participate in Fit4Co.

The success yielded by advertising can thus be credited largely to the previous communication offensive. Prior to and during the advertisement phase, the Fit4Co team actively searched for ways to convey information to potential interested parties. Methods included official info days in the three capital cities of the Euroregions, an information campaign via a large-scale e-mail database, and advertising of the project via media coverage.

Likewise, a Fit4Co info day was conducted in Klagenfurt to stimulate interest in cooperation across EGTCs. Among the 18 approved cooperation tandems, two tandems plan trans-EGTC projects.

The selected tandems were invited to come to attend a two-day launch event in September of 2019 at the Euregio Cultural Center in Toblach / Dobbiaco.

The cooperation of the project partners resulted not only in the project attaining greater diversity; it also enabled different approaches to be used to achieve the same goal of promoting cross-border projects. The EGTC European Region Tyrol – South Tyrol – Trentino pursued a "bottom-up" approach and chose not to limit the thematic areas. The EGTC Euregio Senza Confini laid down the topics together

with the stakeholders in the context of exchange meetings.

The awareness campaign's activities focused on the inclusion of organizational units in project tandems. Besides the aforementioned info event in Klagenfurt, Fit4Co info meetings were held in various different local administrations in Friuli Venezia Giulia and Veneto. The awareness campaign was supplemented with the exchange of information by e-mail and direct conversations of the FGTC with interested administrative organizations. The EGTC was also active in the transboundary search for project partners for interested administrative organizations.

Project structure

The Fit4Co project works with the tandem system. The project proceeds in five phases through which the individual tandems progress.

The organizational entities in public administration are defined as the target group of Fit4Co. This includes specialized departments of the regions and states, municipal and community-level administrations, the administrative bodies of public institutions like universities or district governments, publicly-owned utilities, social partners, and government agencies (e.g., law enforcement).



For this reason, the Fit4Co project assigns a coach to each tandem. This coach is responsible for structuring the progress of the project and giving it the necessary impetus. In this context, a market study was carried out and ten freelancers were selected from among the applicants in the area of project support and consulting. This system ensures that the partners receive the necessary professional support.

The coaches assume the function of process support: They are responsible, inter alia, for the structure and progress of the workshops. They determine the individual needs and requirements of the tandems and adapt the implementation of the workshop to the group's concrete needs. At the same time, they raise the group's awareness of the special role of cross-border cooperations and intercultural cooperation.

The coaches support the tandems, but the cooperation tandem itself is responsible for the project's overall progress and results. The tandem elaborates the project and acts as an interface to the participating administrative organizations. The roles and tasks are laid down in the tandem.

The project coordinator is the motivating force behind the project and also the central contact person for the Fit4Co team.

The Fit4Co team provides the tandems with organizational support. The Fit4Co project managers Maria Messner and Stefan Graziadei prepare the tandem meetings with regards to organization and technical aspects (selecting the conference venue, arranging for language interpreters, determining the need for lodgings in the case of multi-day conferences, etc.). If external expertise is required, the Fit4Co team will provide it. In doing so, the Euregio makes use of internal resources (on the level of directors and staff) as well as of external experts. The Fit4Co team is the connecting link between the tandems, the Euroregion, and the Interreg Program.

This comprehensive support enables the tandems to focus on their concrete goals.

The five phases were deliberately designed as physical meetings. Especially at the beginning of the project, it is important that the partners have physical contact. The informal character of such meetings allows the participants to become acquainted with each other and gain trust within the tandem team.

The goal of the individual tandems is to elaborate a project sketch. During the Fit-4Co process, the roles of the individual partners are clarified, the project's goals are defined, and the funding strategy is elaborated. At the conclusion, there should be a finished project plan or project application on the basis of which work can continue.

But the added value of the Fit4Co process is not restricted to the elaboration of the concrete project sketches. Rather, it is the basis for future cooperations and the creation of a sustainable transboundary network.

1.5 Fit4Co project plan

1.5.1. Launching - Becoming acquainted, networks, and motivation

The first step of the Fit4Co process took place in September of 2019 at the Euregio Gustav Mahler Cultural Center in Toblach / Dobbiaco (South Tyrol). The partners met there for the first time in a two-day conference. In the corresponding workshops, they elaborated their project's first profile. The objective of this launch event was in particular to create a connection between the project partners in the respective tandems, to provide room for informal interactions, and to develop a common spirit. This created the important basis for trust right at the beginning of project elaboration.

The evening event was carried out in cooperation with the Dolomiti Live CLLD Region. It was based on the topic of "European Cooperation Day 2019" under the

motto of "Europe is for you." The participants were thus able to acquire insight into the region's activities and projects. The CLLD Regions have an important role with Fit4Co, too: as partners, in providing impetus, and in promoting cross-border cooperation on the local level.

Toblach / Dobbiaco is also where the first meeting of the potential tandems of the EGTC Euregio Senza Confini took place. The participants there were trained with regards to existent transfrontier projects, best practices, and strategic priorities of the EGTC. The goal was to define thematic areas and to bring the participants closer together so as to nourish an interest in cross-border projects.

1.5.2. 1st Phase: Shaking hands

The first phase had already been scheduled shortly after the launch event; this was to utilize the high motivation generated by the first meeting while it was still fresh. This time, however, the participants did not all come together for a general meeting; rather, each tandem worked independently on its project together with its respective coach.

The concrete findings of the kick-off were again discussed and the targeted vision more concretely formulated. To do this, the tandems work on their project

sketch and thus start their individual process. This included, e.g., the definition of stakeholders, possibly also the obtaining of expert opinions, and establishing the different roles of the partners.

As always, the work steps to be completed by the next phase were also defined. That's because, between the phases, work and communications continued (largely via e-mail or by telephone).

1.5.3. 2nd Phase: Development and planning of joint visions

In January of 2020, the second phase of the Fit4Co process was conducted at the Alpbach Congress Center. This village – known throughout Europe on account of the Alpbach European Forum – seemed like the optimal venue for bringing all of the project tandems together for the two-day halftime meeting. The tandems reported on their successes and the challenges they had to grapple with. In this context, it became clear that there were certain parallels between all of the tandems with respect to project development. This gave the project partners an improved perspective on cross-border cooperation and led to a sharing of the best practices that had been found.

At the same time, differences between the various different tandems became apparent. Some of the tandems had already begun work with a clearly structured

goal, while others were able to concretize their intentions by means of sharing and discussing with the project partners and coaches. Those tandems that were already able to build upon a trusting relationship based on existent cooperation and whose composition remained unchanged displayed accelerated project development. Those two tandems which did not attend the midterm meeting in Alpbach chose to abandon, as a consequence, the Fit4Co path. It became apparent in Alpbach whether the Fit4Co form was the appropriate form for elaborating projects for project tandems.

In particular funding represents a big challenge for many project tandems. For this reason, the Fit4Co team procured several experts to present the various different options and funding channels to the project partners. Because of the transboun-

dary nature of the projects, such European programs as INTERREG are of course of special interest.

In doing this, the second phase combined this training course on funding options with a deepening of the tandem cooperation. The halftime meeting also provided important informal moments between partners and between the different tandems. This boosted motivation and strengthened trust in the respective project partners. Now it would be the goal to convey this motivation into Fit4Co's third phase and the final dash.

1.5.4. 3rd Phase: From the idea to the project

Between the second and third phases, the Corona virus brought society as a whole but also work activities in the area of Euroregions to a halt. Usual work processes ceased, and the work of the Euregio tandems also had to be suspended for a period of three months. This made it necessary to divide the third phase into two parts. The first part was carried out digitally, in the form of virtual conferences, while the second part took place largely on the basis of actual physical meetings.

This challenge of closed borders was solved by holding the first part of the third phase in the spring of 2020 in a new form. To do this, each tandem sought a new platform on which – despite all difficulties – it would be possible to continue working together on a joint project. In this context, the groups – together with their coaches and the Fit4Co team – quickly developed their own, practical solutions.

The tandems were able to work very productively and held video conferences to discuss the progress they had made, the challenges they faced, and the further steps that would have to be taken prior to project completion.

This revised phase was characterized by both difficulties and new possibilities. The use of virtual conferencing meant that the advantages of the important informal communications of physical meetings were lost – but at the same time, it reduced bureaucratic red-tape with respect to travel and personnel costs. Furthermore, the digital format proved to be very efficient time-saving tool.

All in all, this new form showed itself to be an interesting option. Simultaneously, in the course of the online workshops, it was also evident that physical meetings are essential for project success. Communication in digital space enabled the tandems to acquaint themselves with new, flexible options for cross-border cooperation.

In the summer months, the groups therefore met one more time to conclude the third phase. During these meetings, the last touches were put on the projects to prepare for the final event, taking place at Stams Abbey.

2. Fit4Co Project extension: Joining forces to overcome cross-border obstacles

In early August of 2020, the administrative entity in charge of the Interreg-Italy program approved a prolongation of the Fit4Co project till the end of June of 2021. In the extended phase, selected tandems continue receiving support from Fit4Co in implementing their projects. Furthermore, a scientific study will be carried out in both EGTCs for the purpose of analyzing the competences of the Euregio regions with respect to legislative possibilities with a view towards eliminating cross-border obstacles.

After project conclusion, feedback from the participants and the coaches will be collected and analyzed together with experts in the framework of a workshop. The goal of this is to identify barriers to cross-border cooperation and to develop possible solutions and proposals to overcome them.

Fit4Co's objective is to overcome barriers of all kinds. The cooperation tandems represent an attempt to overcome borders from below, on the basis of concrete joint projects. In contrast, the study on legislative competences and the workshop on cross-border obstacles are intended to fulfill the prerequisites for eliminating barriers from above; in this way, it should be possible to fully exploit the potential of cross-border cooperation.

The project is intended to finish where it began. After the kick-off meeting in Trieste, in early summer of 2021, a Fit4Co closing event is to be held in this port city with a unique role in connecting Austria and Italy. This closing event will simultaneously serve as a starting signal for more-intensive cooperation between the two Euregios.

3. Making the project and its added value more visible

Fit4Co offers an innovative approach for cross-border project management and was therefore presented to other European partners as a best-practice project. In early 2019, the Euregio governors Arno Kompatscher (in office as EGTC-president until October of 2019) and Peter Kaiser appealed to Karlheinz Lambertz, (then) president of the Committee of Regions (CoR), for permission to present the project at the EGTC platform meeting in Palma. Secretary General Matthias Fink reported to representatives of the CoR, of the E.U. Commission, and of the other regions about the Fit4Co approach and the initial results of the project groups.

One year later – after conclusion of the work in the project groups – Fit4Co's findings were presented at the European Week of Regions and Cities in the framework of the "EGTCs boosting Cross-Border Cooperation" workshop. On October 13, 2020, the governors Fugatti, Kompatscher, Kaiser, and Barbara Zilli, regional minister of the Friuli Venezia Giulia Autonomous Region in charge of European programs, elucidated the political potential of enhanced cooperation in and between the two EGTCs. During the subsequent discussion session between EGTC Euregio Senza Confini irector Sandra Sodini and Matthias Fink (General Secretary of the European Region Tyrol – South Tyrol – Trentino) the importance of Fit4Co for increased cross-border cooperation in the program area stood in the foreground.

Because of the significance of Fit4Co for cross-border cooperation in Europe, it was possible to gain the Committee of Regions as a joint partner for the event.

Intense PR work was also conducted in the Euroregion. Local media and I journals have reported on the Fit4Co program and its individual projects. The private television network TirolTv was assigned the task of making short videos to inform the citizens about the work of the individual tandems. The project website was designated as the







Tools for analyzing the risk of natural hazards on alpine paths

Long-distance hiking in the Alpine region is booming. Rockslides don't care about administrative boundaries. Entities responsible for watching over

and maintaining footpaths are thus faced with major challenges – especially in view of Climate Change.. RAGNAR is a low-threshold and practical tool for evaluating risks on alpine pathways. It offers a reliable basis for decision-making to determine if and what measures must be taken.

In the context of Fit4Co, this analytical tool is under discussion as a possible uniform approach for use within this Euregio.


Personnel development


E5 long-distance hiking trail


In the context of Fit4Co, the project "River MOVE" was prepared for the Interreg V-A programs. It provides for the enhancement of the rivers




Integrated services for active aging and general wellbeing of people over 65 years of age

Challenges

- Health systems and long-term care systems are in danger of becoming financially unsupportable since a shrinking population may not be capable of fulfilling the needs of a growing number of aging people
- It is indispensible that autonomy and independence be maintained in old age so as to delay for as long as possible the hospitalization of older people – both for the benefit of the older people, themselves, and also to preserve the financial sustainability of the systems
- Promotion of active aging through the use of health care systems focusing on promoting health, preventing disease, and providing access to high-quality and long-term primary health services both in large cities with large numbers of older people and in remote and inaccessible areas (e.g., mountainous areas)

Perspectives

Promoting the provision of services for individuals by the public and private sectors in harmony with quality standards,

- Which attempt to prevent the deterioration in health, well-being, and self-sufficiency
 of older persons and as far as possible to contribute to the restoration of their
 health,
- Which guarantee the fundamental rights and freedoms of older persons, their families, and their care-givers,
- Which react quickly and flexibly to the changing needs of each individual while fully respecting his personal integrity and so to enhance his quality of life,
- Which are easily accessible.
