
104 Bilateral Agreements between **Albania** and **Italy** in 2019

Puglia ports of Bari, Brindisi, Lecce and Taranto: The South Adriatic Gates to TEN-T

Challenges to the functioning of the new regional institutional cross-border joint initiatives



A detachment between policy-making level and technical level



Need for joint vision, better planning, efficient coordination, responsive fundraising, synergies among different connectivity coordination platforms



Continuous institutional building and support for the improvement of skills and capacities of public and private transport actors

SAGOV Findings on Governance assessment in transport connectivity in the SA:

- 1 High territorial fragmentation of transport infrastructure at bilateral or multilateral

- Need for better coordination amongst countries of development objectives
- 4 Need for shared vision and political commitment of countries to the Connectivity Agenda
- Changing priorities for the beneficiaries of connectivity projects
- **6** Low level of communication amongst stakeholders



EU Initiatives

Berlin Process is an initiative aiming to structure WB6 countries' cooperation in their path to EU. According to the EUSAIR "Connecting the Region" covering Transport networks, EUSAIR governing structures also decided to promote a synergic interaction with the "Berlin process".





Connectivity Agenda is one of the main EU assistance mechanisms to support economic growth in the Balkan countries and to speed up the economic convergence with EU MS. Since 2014, CA has been linked to connecting physical infrastructure and energy systems" within the region and of the region with the EU.

WBIF is a joint initiative of the EU, SEE6, International Financial Institutions and bilateral donors that provides financing and technical assistance to strategic connectivity projects in the region.

Box of recommendations

As Albania is about to start the EU negotiations process, this moment requires a commitment of all the Albanian structures in setting up the investment priorities in line with European priorities and Connectivity Agenda. The tasks ahead require focus on updating the NSPP list and preparing the pipeline projects, as well as increased attention on the evaluation of unitary costs and of risk-distribution during the planning and tendering of PPP contracts.

Box of recommendations

Coordinate plans and establish agreements with neighboring countries, with respect to the commitment of both sides in developing and / or upgrading common corridors. Seeking joint processes and financing schemes for projects expanding in both sides of the borders would increase sustainability to the connectivity process.

Box of recommendations

Give more attention to the south-north traffic flows and to the connections with the countries opposite to the Adriatic shore and to the Balkan area whose economy is growing;

Strengthen the role of ports as an interconnection point between maritime transport and other transport modes and restoring the role of Adriatic ports as natural access points to the east and west;

Reduce the distances by ensuring the connection to the main corridors of the TEN-T network.
