

# Hybrid threat is a Western concept to describe 21<sup>st</sup> century security challenge

- Hybrid threat can be characterised as coordinated and synchronised action, that deliberately targets democratic states' and institutions systemic vulnerabilities, through a wide range of means.
- Activities exploit the thresholds of detection and attribution as well as the borders between war/peace, civil/military, friend/enemy, public/private, internal/external etc
- The aim is to influence decision making at the local (regional), state, or institutional level to favour and/or gain the agent's strategic goals while undermining and/or hurting the target.




## **Maritime Security**

- Hybrid actors might target ships, their control mechanisms and navigational systems with electronic interference or cyber-attacks
- Insurance policies typically contain a disclamer against any cyber-related accidents
- Anti-Access and Area Denial operations as well as underwater weapons pose threats that need to be prepared for
  - Member states and institutions should enhance their joint preparedness for counter-measures and attribution
