967 consultancies – pooling of forest owners, management of low quality forests







IMPROVE COOPERATION AND COORDINATION BETWEEN DECISION MAKERS

Strategy for smart use of biomass for energy purposes


- 1. Interdepartamental group (Ministeries, Forest Institute and SFS)-collaboration
- 2. Prevent the use of quality wood for heating purposes
- 3. Improvment of air quality

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THE BIGGEST CHALENGES AFTER-COVID-19

- Problems with the comunication between forest owners and forestry experts
- Big fluctuations of the prices of biomass energy sources
- Qualification of the forest owners for working in the forest
- No real counselling on smart use of woodenbiomass
- Questionable quality of wood used for heating purposes in households







PRIVATE FORESTS DURING PANDEMICS

- Survey questionnaires regularly monitor the impact of the epidemic on the amount of roundwood purchases from private forests
- more than half of the companies surveyed reported a decrease in purchase due to the epidemic-by an average of 27%
- In August the consequences of restrictions in activity have diminished the main reason: less supply in the market and higher prices of wood

PRIVATE FORESTS

- Survey questionnaires regularly monitor the impact of the epidemic on the volume of roundwood purchases from private forests
- more than half of the companies surveyed reported a decrease in purchase due to the epidemic-by an average of 27%
- At the time of the end of the epidemic(August), however, the consequences of restrictions in activity have diminished the main reason: less supply in the market and higher prices of wood








CHANGES IN WOOD ENERGY SECTOR

- March 2020 one of the largest buyers of lower quality wood has stopped with purchase of lower quality wood
- two Slovenian wooden industries continued throughout the epidemic with the purchase of wood and production (one without interference, the other with slightly reduced operation in relation to the available capacity)
- The prices of wood got very high after 2020

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THE SOLUTIONS

- Development of tools that will help us with counselling (on-line, easy to use,...)
- Through projects for the digitalisation of forestry- preparation of interactive sylviculture plan (Slovenian financial scheme EIP, e-GOZD and DIGIGOZD project)



- Collaboration with other institutions that will help us develop such tools (SFI, ARCTUR,...)
- Organisation of workshops and Local stakeholders meetings within BIO4ECO Project
