THE PROJECT LOOKS TO improve the effectiveness of *regions and cities as facilitators* of internationalization processes. Cities and regions promote international relations and act as governance actors and enablers for a range of local stakeholders who cooperate to make regions (not just single SMEs) as better able to pursue internationalization.

THE PROJECT DEPLOYS A NEW METHODOLOGY: approaching internationalization not by addressing uniquely SMEs, but by addressing the regional systems of distinctive competences, always bearing in mind that the final objective is to support SMEs internationalization.

COMPETE-IN IS ALSO ENGAGED with facilitating the **exchange of good practices and transfer of knowledge** among the partners' territories about internationalization, focusing in particular on penetration of territories, attraction of economic and social resources and creation of international partnerships.

THE EXPECTED OUTCOMES of the Compete-In project are improvements of internationalization policies and the creation of local cooperation processes making all relevant stakeholders (SMEs, universities/research centres, trade associations, Chambers of Commerce, local/regional governments) acting as part of a regional system to be internationalized.

With only 13% of European SMEs operating in 3rd country markets, there is considerable economic potential for them.
