Regolamento CTE – Article 2(3)(a)

to reinforce the effectiveness of cohesion policy



At least half of the policy instruments addressed by a project need to be related to Structural Funds programmes

ERDF + ESF = Structural Funds + Cohesion Fund

= The Funds + EAFRD + EMFF = ESI Funds
