Masterclass with Phillip Blond

On the 2nd of June BDF organised a masterclass with **Phillip Blond** in cooperation with Bedrijf 79 and Innovatiepact Fryslân. Phillip Blond is **director of ResPublica** (one of the most influental think tanks in the UK), author of Red Tory (2010), and considered **one of the leading political philosophers** of the United Kingdom. Mr. Blond talked about how a city faces depopulation when a city does not innovate. Companies will leave, talented youth will leave.

To prevent this, Mr. Blond beliefs in creating attractive 'ecosystems'. If we want to keep the talented youth and the growing companies in the area, we need to create an ecosystem that enables and stimulates creativity and innovation.

It was a very inspiring masterclass with a high turnout that brought together politicians, innovation experts, entrepreneurs, students and city councilors.

In June, Erna and Frank hosted two workshops on project financing for Stenden, NHL and Van Hall University staff. Invited by Stenden's SubsidyPoint, we covered important aspects of project proposal writing and project management in relation to i.a. Erasmus+, INTERREG and national programs. The first workshop covered the basics and the second workshop was an advanced course. Participants gained insights into the strategic considerations involved in the processes of project proposal writing and project management, illustrated by some practical tools

developed by BDF to this end. The case studies sparked discussion among the participants as they shared their own **experiences**, **success stories and pitfalls**.

We are keen to follow up with the participants and other people interested in project financing. If you like to get involved as well or discuss your project ideas, please contact Erna and Frank.




Dedicated to improve internationalisation policy

The Municipality of Leeuwarden and BDF joined forces in the Interreg Europe project UpGradeSME on policy instruments that enhance internationalisation amongst SMEs. The project seeks to improve these policy instruments in several EU regions. Besides Leeuwarden and Fryslân, the cooperating regions are Budapest and Győr in Hungary, the Muntenia region in Rumania, Badenwürttemberg Germany, the Braga district in Portugal and the Basque region in Spain.

BDF and the Municipality of Leeuwarden are dedicated to improve the internationalisation aspect of the Groen Werkt! policy (Green Works!), an instrument of the Municipality of Leeuwarden and the Province of Fryslân that encourages the generation of employment, cross sectoral innovations and the strengthening of human capital. Focus sectors of Groen Werkt! are Water Technology, Agro-Food and Renewable Energy.
