Dear friends of sustainable mobility, dear colleagues and partners, the busy and eventful year of 2019 comes to an end.

Citizens from all over the world started to manifest for more climate protection. With **#fridaysforfuture** the young generation brought the topic of climate change back on the political agendas. Urban mobility needs to become more sustainable and this is what we in **cities.multimodal** are working for.

Let's take a look back, what we have achieved this year.

Some of our cities engaged this year in Mobility Management activities for specific target groups like kindergartens, schools and investors. The **City of Gdansk** implemented, very successfully, a trailer rental campaign for kindergartens where parents could test bicycle trailers. Thereby, they were invited to leave the "parental car taxi" at home. In **Rostock**, the cities' first mobility concept for a car-reduced new housing area was finalized, including recommendations for attractive bicycle parking, cargo bike and trailer rental as well as parking lots for carsharing and electric cars.

During the last three <u>peer reviews</u> in **Riga**, **Gdansk and Vilnius**, our reviewing cities could not just see the first project results but were also able to give helpful advice during the final planning stage of our mobility points. We are already looking forward to their opening in **Riga**, **Vilnius**, **Aarhus**, **Karlskrona**, **Kalmar**, **Guldborgsund** and **Rostock** in spring next year.

This years' European Mobility Week was also a highlight for many of our cities. Tartu, Karlskrona, Rostock & Gdansk engaged with very different activities ranging from offering free public transportation to redesigning a street into a car-free, green, social space, a so-called "living street". During two weeks citizens in Gdansk could experience how a street without cars feels like.

Furthermore, we enhanced transnational cooperation by presenting cities.multimodal together with its sister Interreg BSR projects **SUMBA** and **BSR** electric at this years' **CIVITAS** Forum in Graz. Our projects have a lot in common and we are looking forward to spreading our ideas in the Baltic Sea Region. We are planning a **Joint Mobility Summit** in September next year. More information will follow. Next year you will meet us at the **Active Mobility Congress in Gdansk** and many other


