The Riga Municipal Agency “Riga Energy Agency” has launched the **first mobility point in Riga and Latvia in the VEF district**, connecting different sustainable modes of transport and offering convenient access to micro mobility and public transport opportunities.

The mobility point will also serve as a pilot area for deployment of innovative, data-based solutions, with both a bicycle and pedestrian counter and a testbed for smart city solutions.
