CESBA Neighborhood Award 2018

The INTERREG MED project CESBA MED organizes the CESBA Neighborhood Award 2018. The official award launch event was held on the 12th of June in Barcelona, Spain. The aim of this award is to disseminate and capitalise the tools and methodologies developed by CESBA-MED partners for rating the sustainability of urban areas. The Awards winner presentation takes place from 16th – 17th of May in Scilla, Italy.

The award is organized in the framework of the CESBA MED project, financed by the ERDF Interterritorial cooperation funds of the European Union through the Interreg Mediterranean Programme. CESBA MED intends to develop an innovative decision making model and a transnational common set of assessment tools to support the definition and implementation of actions targeted to optimise sustainability planning measures combining the building and urban scale.

The neighborhood award fosters a competitive challenge for urban areas in certain categories / for certain criteria's: by population (urban areas in cities under 10.000 inhabitants, between 10.000 and 50.000 inhabitants and over 50.000 inhabitants) or by sort of projects (new developments, existing retrofitted areas, areas under a planned or project phase retrofitting). An international jury composed by reputed professionals, belonging to the sphere of urban development, spatial planning, architecture or energy efficiency and sustainable development as well as politics and policies will evaluate and honor the winners of the award. The winners of each category will receive a certificate and a diploma, publication of the projects as well as a dedicated time slot for presentation during the World Sustainability Built Environment (SBE) Conference in Gotenburg in June 2020.
