








II. Pilot area Alexandroupoli-Makri (1A)



Urban-suburban coastal area with potential for sustainable tourism development

Next to Natura 2000 site with low habitat loss

Accessibility by car, train, airplane, ferry connection

Recreational boating prospects

Increasing urban development and littoralization pressures from leisure activities

Conflicting land uses

Shoreline subjected to erosion from Alexandroupoli's port and channel

Lack of coordination and public participation processes





II. Pilot area Alexandroupoli-Makri (1A)

Actions foreseen and expected results

Ensuring lasting sustainability of coastal and maritime tourism development in REMTH: Local Action Plan for Alexandroupoli/ Makri area including small scale studies to address critical local challenges for sustainable tourism development:

- Small scale study on coastal erosion mechanisms and port channel silting-up
- Measures for reducing port channel dredging impacts
- Coastal erosion measures for protecting the urban sea front
- Measures for reducing conflicts between parallel activities/ conflicting land uses
- Actions for promoting sustainable tourism development of the urban sea front (ongoing urban renewal project) → addressing littoralization pressures
- Bridging legal framework gaps



Actions foreseen and expected results

Ensuring lasting sustainability of coastal and maritime tourism development in REMTH: Local Action Plan for Thassos-Keramoti area including small scale studies to address critical local challenges for sustainable tourism development:

- Small scale study on coastal erosion and inundation mechanisms
- Measures addressing River delta retreat and sea water intrusion
- Measures for reducing conflicts between parallel activities/ conflicting land uses
- Actions for promoting tourism development inside the Natura 2000 protected area → enhancing eco –tourism activities
- Future planning of eco tourism activities and low impact economic activities (aquaculture, agriculture etc.)
