
Promoting the co-evolution of human activities and natural systems for the development of sustainable coastal and maritime tourism

WHAT IS NEW?



CO-EVOLVE to end in October 2019!

The project's Testing phase, which had started in Frebruary 2018, ended in May 2019. It consisted in translating in practice the findings of WP3 in order to implement Pilot Actions (plans, concrete actions and measures), setting the conditions for a sustainable tourism in coastal areas and related maritime space and promoting robust and transparent decision-making processes in the project's 7 pilot areas.


All <u>Pilot Areas</u> coordinators (Region of East Macedonia and Thrace; Po Delta Veneto; Regione Emilia-Romagna; Port of Valencia; Hérault Department; RERA SD; DUNEA) successfully completed their pilot actions.

Partners are now involved in the Transferring phase (WP5), which intends to guarantee the long-term impact of the project activities and results, through their continuation, share and replication at local/regional scales (beyond the territorial/administrative limits of the pilot areas) and at Mediterranean level (national authorities).

Moreover, up until now, a lot has also been done in terms of communication and enhancing CO-EVOLVE's visibility. For instance, the consortium has established strong interactions with the 'Sustainable Tourism' thematic community and monitors several Euro-Mediterranean initiatives and strategies of interest i.e. the UfM agenda on the Blue Economy, the WestMED initiative, the Interreg MED PANORAMED project, the Bologna Charter, the BLUEMED Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA).

THE SHOW MUST GO ON



Since the launch of the UfM-labelled <u>MedCoast4BG</u> project in January 2018, a lot has been done to ensure the durability of the project and its extension to other territories. For instance, a project proposal (Co-Evolve4BG) that had been submitted under the ENI CBC MED first call for standard projects, was recently selected for funding. This project consists in extending CO-EVOLVE's methodology in new pilot areas, including Tunisian and Lebanese ones.

After the first meeting of MedCoast4BG, which took place in Barccelona on 31 October, back-to-back with CO-EVOLVE's 5th Steering Committee and Second Training Course, two other meetings were organised by both projects' partners and observers, including representatives from Southern and Eastern Mediterranean countries i.e. **Tunisia** (National Institute of Marine Sciences and Technologies); **Morocco** (Ministry for Agriculture, Fisheries, Rural Development, Waters and Forests; as well as the L'Oriental Region) and **Lebanon** (Ministry of Works and Public Transport). Further potential partners and observers have been identified in the Southern Adriatic-Ionian area, especially in **Albania** and **Montenegro** (Puglia Region, University of Bari, Municipality of Herceg Novi, Auleda).

Another proposal was submitted under the Interreg IPA CBC Italy-Albania-Montenegro Programme to cover the Southern Adriatic-Ionian area.

Additional Pilot Areas -which will complement the existing ones in the frame of CO-EVOLVE-have been identified in all these countries. These are complementary as they are different both in geographical and characteristics (problems encountered and peculiarties) terms.

OUR EVENTS

CO-EVOLVE 6th Steering Committee – 9/10 April 2019 (Montpellier)



The 6th Steering Committee was organised in Montpellier on 9-10 April by the Département de l'Hérault. It coincided with the closing of the Testing phase. On this occasion, key internal issues were discussed, in particular the final report of the project's <u>7 pilot areas</u>, the

interaction with local stakeholders and the transferring phase, which started one month after the meeting, in May. It was organised back-to-back with a meeting of the CPMR-IMC 'Economic and Social Cohesion' Working Group, which focused on youth, social and solidarity economy and sustainable tourism.

The event included a joint session of the CO-EVOLVE and MedCoast4BG project, which was the occasion for partners and observers of both projects to exchange on the project's advancement and explore further funding opportunities and synergies with other relevant initiatives i.e. <u>MUSES</u> project, BLUEMED Coordination and Support Action (<u>BLUEMED CSA</u>), the <u>Bologna Charter</u>, <u>West MED</u> and <u>PANORAMED</u>. In addition to this, potential new pilot areas located in Mediterranean Partner Countries were presented by delegates -partners of MedCoast4BG- that were invited for the occasion.

"Ti porto nel cuore" – 19 March 2019 (Cattolica)



The Emilia Romagna Region organised a public meeting entitled "Ti Porto nel Cuore" ("I hold you close to my heart") in the frame of CO-EVOLVE at the Palazzo del Turismo in Cattolica. This meeting aimed to present the results of the participatory process conducted for about a year as part of CO-EVOLVE.

In Cattolica, over the past twelve months, four laboratories have been set up, involving different stakeholders: public bodies, universities, associations and companies. The "Ti Porto nel Cuore" initiative was the occasion to present the ideas and proposals that emerged during the meetings.

In particular, Marco Pellegrini (UniBo-DIN) and Giovanni Preda (Trevi SpA) illustrated the feasibility project for the construction of an overall system for remodelling and managing the seabed with the use of ejectors. Carlo Albertazzi (Emilia-Romagna Region SDSCB) and Alessandro Costa (Municipality of Cattolica) presented the information gathered on a possible agreement protocol aimed at regulating a "special consultation" for the needs of the port complex. Maria Vittoria Prioli (Municipality of Cattolica) reported on the indications for a separate waste collection in the port area. Finally, Leonardo Marotta and Cesarino Romani (Cetacea Foundation) focused on possible actions to reduce the contribution of fine sediments from the basins upstream of the port area.

CO-EVOLVE Dissemination Event – 3-5 June 2019 (Barcelona)



On the occasion of the <u>Mediterranean Sustainable Tourism Convention 2019</u> -organised by the Interreg MED Sustainable Tourism community- which took place on 5-7 June in Barcelona, CO-EVOLVE partners organised a series of conferences linked to the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) labelled <u>MedCoast4BG</u> and the ENI CBC MED Co-Evolve4BG.

These conferences aimed to take stock of the activities carried out so far by CO-EVOLVE and share its <u>main related outcomes</u> (Syntheses of Threats and Enabling Factors to Sustainable Tourism; Sustainability toolkit; Strategic planning at pilot areas scale; conclusions of the pilot actions in the 12 pilot sites) as well as to present the planned transferring/capitalising activities in collaboration with MedCoast4BG and Co-Evolve4BG. They brought together partners of the three projects as well as delegated from other partner countries (i.e. Morocco) and representatives from other projects.

Most CO-EVOLVE partners also took part in the <u>Mediterranean Sustainable Tourism</u> Convention 2019 to exchange on the outcomes of the projects of the Community.

MedCoast4BG/Co-Evolve4BG/CO-EVOLVE partners are now exploring other opportunities and initiative to further expand the project's methodology, especially in Morocco and the southern

Adriatic area.

The Intermediterranean Commission (IMC) of the Conference of Peripheral Maritime Regions of Europe (CPMR), which is partner of MITOMED+, is organising the project's Capitalisation conference on Monday 7 October 2019 in Brussels, at the Delegation of the Generalitat de Catalunya.

The event aims to present the main outcomes of the project mainly through the presentation of the MED M&C Tourism Management Model and the on-going experiences of implementation into MITOMED+ pilot destinations and beyond. It is aimed to EU policy

makers, destination managers, professionals in the tourism sector and regional and local policy makers, among others. On this occasion, Memorandum of Understanding will be signed by the destinations to commit themselves for the implementation of the integrated MED M&C tourism management model.

It also intends to discuss the implementation of a joint Mediterranean Maritime and Coastal tourism management model, its reflection in the policy of regional authorities in the field of sustainable tourism and in the EU agenda. On this occasion, policy recommendations will be addressed to the policy makers in order to better defined a common framework for sustainable tourism development.

This conference will be organised in the margins of the <u>European Week of Regions and Cities</u>, during which are organised <u>PANORAMED Participatory Lab</u> (8 October at 14h30-17h00), <u>Interreg MED Piazza</u> (9 October at 11h30-13h00), <u>Empowering territories for a sustainable future for the Mediterranean</u> - Interreg MED Horizontal projects' event (9 October at 14h30-16h00) and CIVITAS DESTINATIONS Working Group to address mobility and tourism challenges at site level.
