



We are an EU funded project which promotes the use of social innovation to address key societal challenges. The project involves 9 partners from across the UK, Spain, Portugal, France and Ireland. Cork City Council is the Irish partner and in Cork we are focused on using social innovation to address issues being faced by social enterprises and look at innovative ways of stimulating civic engagement in the city. Participants at the Atlantic Social Lab Virtual Final Conference - September 2020

The Atlantic Social Lab Final Conference took place virtually on the 16th of September 2020. It was hosted by the City of Pau in the South of France and all partners participated and played an active role in the event. From Cork, we presented the different actions that we have been implementing including the Shape Your City and Cork Voices initiatives as well as the various supports we have delivered to social enterprises in Cork. One of our Cork social enterprises also participated - Ray Burke from Active Connections. Ray gave an overview of his social enterprise and explained to participants the learning and connections his organisation has received from being involved in the project locally. Overall the event was highly interactive and although all partners would have preferred for a non-virtual event participants were engaged and involved throughout.

Latest Ask & Advise



It feels like a lifetime ago now but the Atlantic Social Lab project in Cork with the financial support of the City Council's Social Economic and Environmental Programme as part of the City North West Quarter Regeneration, held an “Ask & Advise Evening” for Social Enterprises in the Glandore Workspace on Lapps Quay in Cork on the 5th of March 2020. This event was the last physical meeting of the Social Enterprise network that has resulted from the Atlantic Social Lab in Cork and saw a presentation from Rethinking Ireland (previously known as the Social Innovation Fund Ireland) on one of their funds as well as a presentation from business man and Cork native Danny O’ Donavan of Quickminutes.com. This event saw a strong participation from social enterprises and related support agencies in Cork.
