## 1 Introduction

## 1.1 Scope and objectives of the deliverable

This report has been developed within the ESMARTCITY project of the European program Interreg MED, and serves as a deliverable for the activity A2.9 "Communication with the Interreg MED Programme communication strategy". More specifically, it represents one of the three deliverables D2.9.7 "**MED Programme Event / Meeting Participation**" detailing the project participation in the "Made in MED" Conference organized in Rome in April, 2018. The aim is to develop a report for each one of the events in which ESMARTCITY project participated.

The MED Programme follows a 3 level architecture. At 1<sup>st</sup> level modular projects are classified into 3 axes: innovation, low-carbon economy, and natural and cultural resources. At 2<sup>nd</sup> level horizontal projects help build thematic transnational communities clustering modular projects. Eight communities have been formulated related to the three axes and more specifically Green Growth, Blue Growth and Social & Creative for Innovation Axis, Efficient Buildings, Urban Transport, and Renewable Energy for Low-Carbon economy axis, and Sustainable Tourism, and Biodiversity protection for Natural and Cultural Resources Axis. Finally, at the 3<sup>rd</sup> level Strategic projects and the PANORAMED platform exploit evidence based results of the Horizontal projects.

The Esmartcity project is a modular of Axis 1 – Innovation, clustered under the Green Growth Community Horizontal project.

The aforementioned architecture of MED places emphasis in the interaction of the three levels, so as to facilitate exploitation of results. Public events and conferences play an important role in this context. Participation in MED organized events provides the opportunity of the different projects of the different communities to come together and exchange experiences. ESMARTCITY project has implemented different activities in this context, such as attendance to the "MADE in MED" conference in Rome on April 18, 2018.

# 2 Description of the event and agenda

#### **EVENT:**

The "Made in MED – Crafting the future Mediterranean" Conference was help in Rome, Italy on April 18-19, 2018. The Conference was built on the concept of Fablab – Fabrication Laboratory and it helped present the first results of 90 projects co-financed by the MED Programme in a unique way. The conference dealt with three transversal themes of climate change, blue economy and inclusive growth aggregating project achievements from the different communities established by the MED programme. The conference was paired by an exhibition giving a taste and concrete feeling of project activities and results. Round tables helped catch the political dimension behind the current situation and its envisaged scaling up so as to address the future in the Meditarranean.

The objectives of the conference are codified as follows:

- Illustrate how the three level architecture of the MED programme (modular, horizontals and governance projects) helps achieve tangible contributions through an integrated process that enables efficient interactions between the three levels
- Demonstrate the merits of transnational cooperation in dealing with common problems in the Mediterranean area
- Encourage integration with other programmes
- Reinforce the Interreg MED message at European and local policy level

# 4 Synergies and results /lessons learnt

The "Made in MED" conference was the first MED large scale event that the Esmartcity project participated in, as its kick off meeting took place in Rome adjacent to the MED conference. The conference provided a good opportunity to better understand the architecture of the MED program and establish contacts with MED program, the MED Green Growth community and different projects that are related to the topic of Smart Cities, coming both from Green Growth community and other communities of the program.

The event emphasized on the need of participation and involvement so as to address the future needs and challenges of the MED area. The needs to identify and involve the most suitable stakeholders in the MED area coming from the entire Quadruple Helix, to build out of these partnerships successful projects, to funnel the project outcomes to the policy making level so as to produce sustainable results, to involve the general public, are fundamental for the success of the MED program and for the resilience of the entire MED area.

The Esmartcity project contributes to this problematic by creating a network of stakeholders involving the Quadruple Helix in the context of Smart Cities. In will be involved in pilot testing so as to stir missing public authority pull for the Smart City market that remains largely technology pushed. Out of the pilot testing and collection of lessons learnt the project will elaborate a Green Paper on Innovation Policy Change addressing policy recommendations to help transfer the project results wider in the MED area. The policy recommendations will be classified against policy objectives, specific objectives and investment priorities of framework programs and operational programs at EU, national and regional / local level so as to identify the most appropriate path of intervention. A Smart City Protocol accepted by public authority stakeholders will detail this classification and provide a related action plan.

The Esmartcity project is in line with the four key points of the conference: participation, reinforcement, growth and vision. It addresses participation through its Quadruple Helix networked community. It reinforces territories via its pilot testing and capacity building activities. It addresses growth as the Smart City theme can enhance entrepreneurship and innovation in the MED territories through Open Data and Infrastructures for innovative applications breaking the silos between application domains. Finally, its policy recommendations contribute to a vision for Greener and more Innovative Europe.
