

COMPOSE Final conference took place in Maribor on 5th of September 2019. Project, led by Chamber of agriculture and forestry of Slovenia, Agriculture and forestry Institution in Maribor connects 11 partners from 11 MED regions: Slovenia, France, Portugal, Spain, Italy, Greece, Monte negro, Albania, Bosnia



ENERGY EFFICIENCY AND RENEWABLES WORKING IN SINERGY TO REACH CLIMATE NEUTRALITY BY 2050



Prof. Lucka Kajfez Bogataj started the panel on energy poverty with an experience from University's lecture room, where she tested the energy literacy of her students. According to her persuasion, the energy literacy is very low, even between students and higher educated people. Her observations have been confirmed by Marie Maud Gerard from GERES, a French energy agency, which tested energy efficiency in

vulnerable households. She is convinced that energy poverty is a consequence of lower literacy and behaviours. Stane Klemencic. director of Chamber of agriculture form Maribor pointed out the problematics of scattered settlements in Slovenia, which cause many problems regarding cost efficiency and satisfaction of energy services. Fatbardh Sallaku, dean of Agricultural University in Tirana appointed the importance of early awareness rising, which should be involved into the primary schools as a part of basic education.



Strategic trends in energy sector was a panel, moderated by Sergio Andreis, who invited participants to attend the "Energy efficiency and renewable political forum, to be held in EU parliament in Brussels don 8th of October 2019 and hosted by COMPOSE and Kyoto club. Panellists Zoran Kordić from Green Energy Cooperative, Ivan Zagar, Mayor of the Municipality Slovenska Bistrica and Photoula Hadjipapa, mayor of Municipality Lakatamia stressed the importance of involvement of local communities into development processes to avoid the bureaucratic and other barriers by implementation of energy projects. Sergio Andreis, an experienced lobbyist and politician is convinced, that all European citizens shall request more ambitious targets, set by local, regional and national policies.





LOCAL COOPERATIVES MOVE THE MILESTONES!

Nature park. Within COMPOSE they set the living lab, which use the solar energy for cooking, food and seed drying and watering of orchard. Director of the park Barbara Leao de Cervalho stressed the importance of local cooperatives on an example of greening and afforestation of areas, damaged by forest fires. They organized joint activities in renewing the landscape and marketing of organic products. This very interesting panel was concluded with discussion about the energy management solutions in local environment, explained by Theocaris Tsoutsos, head of RESEL institute by TUC from Crete. Virginia Domingo Reig organized noumerous of awareness rising campaignes in Granollers, the suburb of Barcelona.
