



COMPOSE partners are finishing the implementation of pilot cases

COMPOSE project partners, joined at the 4th meeting in Sutomore (Monte Negro), presented the results and challenges of 15 pilot cases, implemented in 11 MED regions. They agreed about common indicators to monitor the short- mid and long- term results of planned actions. In the 2nd part of the project progress, the main emphasis is in transferring of knowledge as well as capitalization activities, which will result a memorandum of understanding.

COMPOSE model is going to be presented soon

During the 2nd, modular phasis of the project, partners will present COMPOSE model within workshops for decision makers, policy makers and expert public as well. At the final stage of the project, wich is going on until september 2019, partners are developing a common decision making tool, which will be available at local, regional or national level.

Climate Change Mitigation, Organic Agriculture and Human health: Status Quo and New Data

European parliament, Brussels, 28th June 2018:

Climate change mitigation in the Mediterranean, COMPOSE project and IPCC (Intergovernment Panel on Climate Changes) were presented by Lučka Kajfež Bogataj, Climatology Professor, University of Ljubljana and 2007 IPCC Nobel Peace Prize winner.

Prof. Lučka Kajfež Bogataj, the ambassador of COMPOSE stressed the importance and urgency of ambitious mitigation, adaptation and energy literacy policies. As review editor for the next IPCC report, she anticipated that the 1,5 increase is expected around 2025, while collected data indicate an exponential growth in extreme meteorological events in the years affected by the temperature increase between +1,5 and +2 degrees. **Bas Eickhout**, Member of the European Parliament's Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Food Safety argued that more needs to be done and that the 2030 targets should be increased if the Paris Agreement may have a chance of delivering on the promises shared by the world leaders when signing it. **Neoklis Sylikiotis**, Member of the European Parliament's Conference of Delegation Chairs and of the Committee on Industry, Research and Energy, recalled the negative climate change impacts already occurring in Cyprus and elaborated on the priority to be given to mitigation programmes. He underlined delays on ambitious EU energy and climate targets implementation and argued that the EU has a special responsibility not only towards its own citizens, but also towards other world regions.

Andrea Vettori, Deputy Head of Unit - Land Use & Management Unit – DG Environment of the European Commission, elaborated on the Commission's land management priorities in agriculture. He emphasized how crucial the soil dimension is also for climate change mitigation and adaptation purposes and provided participants with an overview of the situation in the various Member States, arguing that more needs to be done in territorial planning to protect European soils and taking into consideration their rich diversity.

The session was moderated by **Sergio Andreis** from Kyoto club, a partner in COMPOSE.



26 Wind turbines and 72 MW produced energy

Wind farm Krnovo is the first wind farm at the Balkan peninsula, which connects more than 20 wind turbines. The installed power is 72 MW. They produce 200 GWh, what enough electric energy for 50.000 households. The wind turbines are located at the altitude of 1.500 m, where the average wind speed achieves 6 m/s. Financing of the project was supported by European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, German development bank KfW IPEX- Bank and French development fund Proparco. The investment, carried out by Austrian company Ivicom Consulting and French company Akuo energy added up to 120 mio EUR. In the framework of COMPOSE Project, partner ISSP is implementing economic analyses and prognosis for further 10 years. After first year of fully operation, first analyses show that the wind farm supplies about 8% of electricity in total production of Monte Negro. .



Next meeting in November 2018 in Granollers

Next project partners meeting will take place in November in Granollers, hosted by partner Ajuntament Granollers. The goal of this meeting is to share the principles of transferring knowledge and the progress of capitalisation activities.
