A THEMATIC STAKEHOLDER WORKSHOP

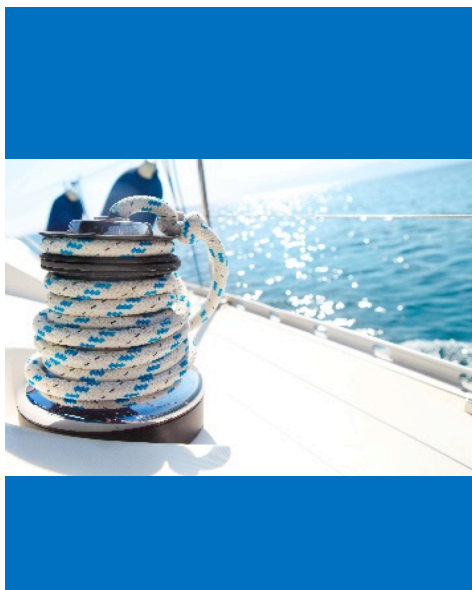
External Meeting Proposal from Chamber of Commerce of Seville for sharing knowledge and creating an useful network for iBLUE.

The **thematic stakeholder workshops** will be at the core of the UfM Regional Stakeholder Conference on the blue economy to be **held in Naples at the end of November. They aim to select 9-12 workshops of duration of 1h30 each.** Break-out rooms for workshops will have an average capacity of 100 participants.

Themes of the workshops, as well its format, will be proposed by the blue economy stakeholders. Each workshop will deal with a topic relevant to the blue economy in the Mediterranean Sea-basin, in line with the priorities of the UfM Ministerial Declaration of 17 November 2015 such as:

- Marine research and innovation
- Education, training and skills development in the maritime domain
- Business development (maritime clusters, start-up, boosters, etc.) and investment (access to finance) in the blue economy
- Maritime transport safety and security, and sustainable ports
- Sustainable aquaculture and fisheries, including small scale fisheries and coastal communities' development
- Coastal and maritime tourism and marinas
- Maritime Spatial Planning and Integrated Coastal Zone Management
- Renewable marine energies
- Sustainable consumption and production in the blue economy
- Marine and coastal environment protection (including Marine Protected Areas), marine pollution (including marine litter)

The topics are indicative; the proposal can also focus on sub-topics or combine several topics together.

It is expected that each workshop will produce practical conclusions which can assist in advancing on the objectives of the UfM Ministerial Declaration and possibly lead to project ideas and proposals. The conclusions will be shared amongst all UfM blue economy stakeholders through the Virtual Knowledge Centre (<http://www.med-vkc-blueeconomy.org>).

Workshop proposals will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- The proposal is focused on one of the topics in the list above;
- The format of the workshop includes interactive elements;
- The content is innovative and speakers are appropriate and qualified;
- The proposed speakers reflect a good geographical coverage and gender balance.
