Word of the Coordinator

We have now reached the mid-term of our project. It has been a very productive period during which all partners have worked intensively to test SHERPA's methodology in their buildings. Thanks to this hard work and despite some delays, we have officially reached the initial target of 100 regional buildings in which the methodology is being tested. All buildings have completed the first two steps of the testing phase, which consist in identifying and characterising each building, as well as carrying out energy diagnoses and benchmarking analyses. The remaining two steps — i.e. identification of energy efficiency measures and calculation of related cost and energy savings, and financing analysis to find best financing operative schemes — are well under way and should be completed by the end of September.



In parallel to this, the project's transferring activities have already started. Coinciding with SHERPA's 4^{th} Steering Committee, the Joint Transferring Seminar of the project was organised, with the aim of coordinating the transference of SHERPA's pilot experimentation

Finally, we are also preparing for the capitalising phase during which the methodology will be extended to as many Mediterranean regions and municipalities as possible. It is to note that we are progressively reaching a critical mass of people interested in our activities. To date, we have 94 observers from different countries (Spain, Italy, France, Greece, Croatia, Malta, Tunisia and Morocco). This number is expected to increase, especially thanks to the upcoming national transference seminars.

TESTING



GOVERNANCE

100 buildings were identified and corresponding ERB projects are under preparation. Identifying the buildings and collecting data required a lot of effort. In parallel to this, a first idea of SHERPA's Building Card was presented to partners. It is one of the project's deliverables which will be granted to each building in which the project's methodology was applied, as a proof of its compliance with SHERPA's standards and methodology.

INFORMATION SYSTEM

Thanks to the activities of this group, an extendable database was set up. Many improvements were made compared to the beta version. Some conclusions were drawn concerning the activities carried out, in particular the fact that benchmarking was one of the most useful features bringing added value for the renovation projects. Partners are now preparing recommendations.





TRAINING

Regional training sessions were held in all SHERPA partner Regions in order to raise awareness on the project among the agents and buildings' owners and define the best energy efficiency measures to be implemented, both in technical and financial terms.

FINANCING

Partners discussed the feasibility of the financing of the foreseen measurements of each pilot. 4 steps were defined as part of this process: (1) promoter assessment, (2) credit assessment, (3) project assessment and (4) return assessment. This being done, partners now need to identify the financial characterisation (per country) and the financial modelsation (per project) of their buildings.

Meeting with SHERPA observers

On the occasion of SHERPA's 4th Steering Committee in Marseille, partners met with several representatives from Mediterranean regions - i.e. Lazio, Abruzzo, Emilia-Romagna, Calabria, Catalonia, Valencia, Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur, Occitanie, Crete, Western Greece, Gozo - as well as with two Tunisian municipalities i.e. Carthage and Sidi Bou Said.

SHERPA Joint Transferring Seminar

The Joint Transferring Seminar (JTS) took place in Marseille on the 18th July 2018, coinciding with the project's 4rth Steering Committee. It aimed to debate the present state of the testing Work Package and agree on the main messages to transfer and how to share the conclusions to the other regions and municipalities within the MED area. The JTS is one of the 3 transferring activities foreseen by the project, together with the Joint Transferring Plan and National Transference Seminars.





Preparing National Transference Seminars

National coordinators have started defining the structure and preparing SHERPA's National Transference Seminars, to be held between autumn 2018 and spring 2019. The seminars aim to increase the number of observers as well as the number of authorities actually replicating the project's methodology in their buildings.

Discussing SHERPA's Joint Action Plan

SHERPA's Joint Transferring Seminar, which took place in Marseille on the occasion of the project's 4th Steering Committee, was the occasion to discuss about the Joint Action Plan (JAP) that aims to retake the project's methodology and tools, and set guiding principles and actions in terms of energy renovation in Mediterranean buildings. The JAP is expected to be released in spring 2019, in the frame of SHERPA's Capitalising phase.
