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OBJECTIVES AND APPROACH OF THE SPANISH Plastic Busters MPAs INFO DAY

Following the project communication strategy, the project Plastic Busters MPAs progress and outputs would be disseminated at national level through national info day events to be organized in each partner country. The Spanish Plastic Busters MPAs Info Day gathered 35 participants and was the first one and was held in the Seville Aquarium on 11th April 2019, within the MARLICE International Forum. The project info day served as a networking opportunity for the identified target groups streamlining the project harmonized approaches.

The objectives of the Spanish Plastic Busters MPAs Info Day were:

- To inform about the project activities
- Engage marine litter community within the project
- Create synergies with other related projects
- To showcase specific marine litter activities in the country by project partners

The event was conceived as a workshop to explain the project, engage the audience and promote synergies with related initiatives. It included the following elements:

1. Introduction to the project: justification, the Interreg Med program, main deliverables and expected outcomes, policy aspects.
2. Marine litter science in MPAs and biodiversity. Contribution of the project to science-based solutions to marine litter, specific contributions in terms of harmonized approaches.
3. Showcase specific project activities in the country and related work by project partners. Specific project activities in the country and MPAs with reference to ongoing activities such as the Program of Measures within MSFD. Related partners' activities that are in line with Plastic Busters MPAs approach were explained to provide the audience with a wider context.
4. Exchange with the audience. Round of Q&A and comments.

WIDER CONTEXT OF THE INFO DAY: MARLICE 2019

The Spanish Plastic Busters MPAs Info Day took place within the [MARLICE 2019](#) (International Forum on Marine Litter and Circular Economy), a larger marine litter event that brought different marine litter related projects together and major European and Mediterranean stakeholders. This three-day event (from 10 to 12 April) was organized by the Spanish Association on Marine Litter (AEBAM) in Seville.



ARC-SCP/RAC identified MARLICE2019 as an opportunity for the Spanish Plastic Busters MPAs info day to:

- 1) Involve as many people and sectors as possible,
- 2) ensure a wide dissemination and communication of the project activities implemented at local, national and Mediterranean level,
- 3) increase the national and regional awareness on ML issue in accordance with the presence of the media on the event,
- 4) gain knowledge from related initiatives and create synergies with them as well as with governance processes at local, national or regional level,
- 5) share marine litter best practices and inspire effective actions at local, national or regional level.

MARLICE2019 was conceived as a cross-sectoral and multi-stakeholder event to advance in the management of marine litter, gathering public authorities, research institutes, private sector and environmental organizations within the framework of the circular economy concept.

Therefore, the Forum served as a platform for projects in the Mediterranean and Atlantic area to hold meetings as part of their actions, thus contributing with content to the sessions and promoting synergies between different sectors, countries and regions.

The general dynamics of the Forum was set up according to the following thematic blocks: 1) governance, 2) research, 3) circular economy & innovation, and 4) awareness & citizens' science.

The Spanish info day was included in the research thematic block 3 (Mediterranean Region Session I, 11th April, 11h30'-13h, coordinated by ARC-SCP/RAC.



STRUCTURE OF THE SPANISH Plastic Busters MPAs INFO DAY

Prior to the Spanish Plastic Busters MPAs info day session (11th April 2019, 11.30-13.00) there was a 4 key-note speeches plenary session in the Auditorium for all the attendants of MARLICE 2019 (see Annex I).

Prof. Maria Cristina Fossi from the University of Siena and scientific project coordinator provided one of the key-note presentations on ML impacts on biodiversity and related indicators, and briefly introduced Plastic Busters MPAs to the audience and encouraged attendance to the Info Day session. The agenda of the key-notes speeches session is included as annex.



Key-Note Speeches. 11.04.2019

After the coffee-break, a 1.5h session was completely focused on the Plastic Busters MPAs project. The session, chaired by **Magali Outters** from ARC-SCP/RAC, introduced the project to later on focus on activities in Spain conducted by Plastic Busters MPAs partners: ARC-SCP/RAC, the Spanish Oceanographic Institute and the Government of the Balearic Islands (National Park of Cabrera). Several presentations were delivered by different member of the project team (see Annex II):

- Prof. Maria Cristina Fossi** from the University of Siena in her presentation ‘The Plastic Busters MPAs in a nutshell and first outcomes’ introduced the background, the partners, the main lines of action of the different WP and the main project features of the project. She particularly discussed the project focus on the whole management cycle of marine litter, and presented the structure of the consortium, harmonized diagnosis, risk assessment, biodiversity monitoring in multiple species, step to step methodological guidelines to implement specific measures in MPAs and the transferring to the South Med coast. The presentation emphasized the gap of knowledge on the ML topic, the need of a harmonization approach of monitoring micro and macro plastic in MPAs, how ML impacts on the biodiversity can be monitored and design specific prevention and mitigation actions based in the diagnosis of the ML situation in certain MPAs.
- Cristina Panti** from the University of Siena in her presentation ‘Novel approach on marine litter impacts on biota through Plastic Busters MPAs’ introduced the novelty of the project in the scientific phase in relation to the selection of species as bioindicators for monitoring marine litter ingestion and impacts on Mediterranean Biodiversity, the effects of microplastic ingestion in fish and invertebrate species and the monitoring of marine litter ingestion and impacts in endangered species (stranded organisms).
- Salud Deudero** from the Spanish Oceanographic Institute (IEO) introduced the work done by one of the Spanish partner of the project. Her presentation ‘Enhancing knowledge on marine litter distribution, patterns, trends and implications for biota in Mediterranean MPAs’ explained the experience of IEO in relation with ML, specifically on the impacts on the biota. She remarked the need to have more field data to achieve plastics pollution indicators. It would be necessary to

quantify the plastics from the surface to the sea floor and its effects (transfer rates and bioaccumulation and how it affects the entire trophic chain) to predict trends and also be able to find some measures. The project allows IEO to deal with connectivity, dispersion and accumulation in the sea floor. ML sources related to tourism in Mallorca are a major threat for the MPA as Cabrera and thus should be particularly studied.

- **Ignasi Mateo** from ARC-SCP/RAC introduced the work done by the Interreg Med Project ACT4LITTER, which provides a suitable ground for Plastic Busters MPAs. His presentation 'Prevention of land-based marine litter affecting MPAs' focused on concrete solutions to prevent and mitigate the impacts of marine litter. The project identified a list of 100 ML measures, with a particular focus on prevention measures, which can be implemented by MPA managers. All identified measures were grouped into 25 categories. The selected measures fed into the ACT4LITTER decision making tool (DMT) which helps MPA managers to identify the most effective measures for their context. The decision making tool helped MPA managers to define priority marine litter measures that were then integrated in 9 MPA-specific actions plans. ACT4LITTER has been a studying project and its outcomes constitute the starting point of national and regional marine litter initiatives (such as Plastic Busters MPAs project) aiming to address ML in MPAs.
- **Maria Francesca López**, director of the National Park of Cabrera explained the situation of this MPA in relation to ML. Her presentation 'Marine litter management: Focus on National Park of Cabrera' detailed the rich marine ecosystem of the archipelago, its history, natural values and the waste management in the MPA and the ML impacts. She also mentioned that the local source of ML, coming from Mallorca Island, has been greatly reduced but sea currents are a notable pathway of ML in the MPA. In that sense the new Waste Law (aligned with the new single-use plastics directive), recently adopted by the regional Government, is a relevant tool to deal with ML. The MPA has started the testing phase (monitoring in 4 areas) as part of the project activities.

Exchange with the audience. Round of Q&A and comments

The audience of the event was wide in terms of geographical scope and background (the list of participants can be found in Annex IV). After the project team presentations Magali Outters gave the floor to the audience for questions and comments.

Gloria Garcia from the Cabo de Gata regional Park explained her very positive experience with ACT4LITTER project and expressed the interest of the park to beneficiate from the Plastic Busters MPAs project in order to give continuity to the work initiated with ACT4LITTER.

Pilar Fernández from the UNED (Spanish on-line University) explained her concern about the toxics components or additives in micro and nano plastic, the difficulty of collecting and analyzing this material and the problem her organization face in relation with tracers / samples. The project team offered support and showed willingness to collaborate in collecting and analyzing samples.

Pedro Fernández from SCP/RAC asked about the origin of latex ML waste found in the south of Cabrera Island. IEO provided a comprehensive explanation on the origins and evolution of marine litter in the archipelago. Indeed the amounts and composition greatly vary according the sea conditions and seasonal pressures.

In addition, after lunch break, the Mediterranean session II - block 3 'Marine litter knowledge and tools in Mediterranean Marine Protected Areas (MPAs)', coordinated by the horizontal PANACeA Project,

introduced the modular Interreg Med project initiatives tackling Marine Litter in the Mediterranean through three round tables. Participation of Plastic Busters MPAs partners (Magali Outters and Ignasi Mateo from ARC-SCP RAC, François Galgani from IFREMER, Cristina Fossi from University of Sienna and M^a Francesca López from National Park of Cabrera (Govern Illes Balears), allowed attendants of the session to have a wide insight on the main lines of action of Plastic Busters MPAs project and also exchange experiences with other related projects.



Block 3. MEDITERRANEAN SESSION II - Coordinated by PANACeA Project: Marine litter knowledge and tools in Mediterranean Marine Protected Areas (MPAs)

The preservation of ecosystems and biodiversity in the coastal and marine environment is tightly linked to achieving several regional targets in the Mediterranean. Ensuring a Good Environmental Status (GES) is a key Mediterranean priority, underpinned by regional frameworks such as the Barcelona Convention for the Protection of the Marine Environment and the Coastal Region of the Mediterranean and the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) Ministerial Declaration on Environment and Climate Change among others. For EU marine waters, the Marine Strategy Framework Directive (MSFD) aims to achieve GES by 2020. Furthermore, the UN Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) sets the Aichi target 11 to protect and effectively manage at least 10% of coastal and marine areas by 2020 with aspirations to increase this percentage in the post-2020 global biodiversity framework. Longer term targets such as the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and the sustainable development goals (SDGs), more concretely Target 14, prioritize the conservation and the sustainable use of oceans, seas, and marine resources for sustainable development.

The Interreg Med Biodiversity Protection Community featured by PANACeA has among its priorities to streamline the efforts of around 200 regional institutions to reinforce actions at Protected area and ecoregional planning and management level to better tackle transboundary pressures, among which marine litter, and foster a more integrated and holistic approach to environmental protection and including a greener economy. The aim of this session is to showcase the joint achievements on marine litter assessment and management tools by the Interreg Med Biodiversity Protection Community, opening a wider discussion on existing gaps and challenges, and the needed actions and integrated solutions at Mediterranean scale. Concrete actions will be highlighted to ensure the uptake of lessons learnt in the Community and to prepare joint recommendations for future action at European and Mediterranean scale.

This community has advanced in identifying some key elements needed to operationalize the coordination and synergy among multiple management scales based on evidence and on participatory approaches: during the CB COP side event co-organized with the Union for the Mediterranean Secretariat in November 2018, major ecoregional planning and management approaches and tools to tackle transboundary pressures like pollution and climate change impacts were discussed, seeking to ensure ecological functioning of Mediterranean ecosystems, while considering multiple pressures and trade-offs.
