### Introduction

The FIRECE project aims to contribute to the achievements of targeted results of Regional Energy Plans through an increased use of (innovative) financial instruments in the Central Europe area. The particular focus is on public support to industry to invest into energy efficiency and renewable energy sources.

Within the activity A.T1.2 Public operators training needs and contents, training modules for coordinators and operators in charge to implement the energy plans were developed.

The training modules (D.T1.2.2 and D.T1.2.3) provide main competence to coordinators and public operators to implement and manage innovative financial instruments (IFIs) for energy plans implementation, particularly concerning the Industry low-carbon transition.





#### Train the trainers module

Train the trainers workshop "Energy efficiency and renewable energy financial instruments for managing authorities - FIRECE project" took place on 17 and 18 January in Brussels. The workshop content was organized in cooperation with the *fi-compass* platform in a two-day course for regional coordinators and partners of the FIRECE project. The workshop provided knowledge and tools for monitoring Energy plans, developing ex-ante assessment procedures and financial schemes and assessing regional investments to Industry on EE/RES.

The *fi-compass* event was attended by over 40 representatives from managing authorities, national banks and other stakeholders involved in the FIRECE project.

The first day of the event was focused on the implementation options of the ESIF financial instruments and the combination of ESIF financial instruments with other forms of support in the programming period 2014-2020. Furthermore, the process of ex-ante assessment was presented extensively followed by a good example of ex-ante assessment for Energy Efficiency.

## Training modules for operators

An on-line training course for public operators and regional coordinators was developed within the activity *A.T1.2 Public operators training needs and contents*. The on-line course was designed so that the entire content of the training material is comprised and conducted within 40 hours. This course was used within the regional activities addressed to local public operators (D.T1.3.3) and followed up the front-desk sessions organized in all project partners regions.

The on-line training course consists of 5 thematic blocks. Each block contains several modules (minimum 3) with similar content structure.
