OIL SPILL PROJECT CONTINUES UNTIL THE END OF 2021

The Interreg BSR Managing Authority/Joint Secretariat (MA/JS) offered a possibility to apply for project prolongation due to the pandemic and the distractions entailed. After discussing this option with the Partners, the OIL SPILL Project Office at the University of Turku sent the application to MA/JS in Rostock. The requested prolongation of the project duration by six months was accepted. Thus, the implementation phase of the OIL SPILL project will last until 31 December 2021 instead of ending in June 2021. Prolongation enables the execution of the postponed events as well as to plan alternatives for those activities that are impossible to implement in current circumstances.

ONLINE MEETINGS

Although the pandemic prevented us from visiting each other, online interaction increased between Project Partners. Besides occasional meetings, two regular discussion sessions were established in Period 4. The OIL SPILL voluntary sector gathers at the beginning of each month to exchange ideas and experiences and plan cooperation. For the whole consortium, a routine of monthly morning coffee meetings was set. It is a casual event that enables discussions both on and off-topic and imitates the informal meetings at a workplace.

NEWS FROM LITHUANIAN RED CROSS

The Lithuanian Red Cross is currently renewing many of its procedures and practices. The new Disaster Preparedness program also takes oil spills into account, and a decision to establish a preparedness team near the coast of Klaipėda was made. Also, the processes of recruiting and training the volunteers are reviewed and updated. Since oil spill response is a new activity for the Lithuanian Red Cross, participation in the OIL SPILL project is important and support from other Project Partners is provided when needed.

The focus was especially on the changes in the risks in the Baltic Sea, costs of the environmental damage, and places of refuge.

PORT OF REFUGE TTX (FI)

If a ship in distress needs a place of refuge, the process has to be clear for all parties. OIL SPILL Project has been initiating a national tabletop exercise on port of refuge operations together with **Finnish Border Guard**, **Finnish Transport & Communications Agency** and other stakeholders, incl. some Finnish OIL SPILL Partners. The exercise takes place in Finland in 2021 (date TBD).
