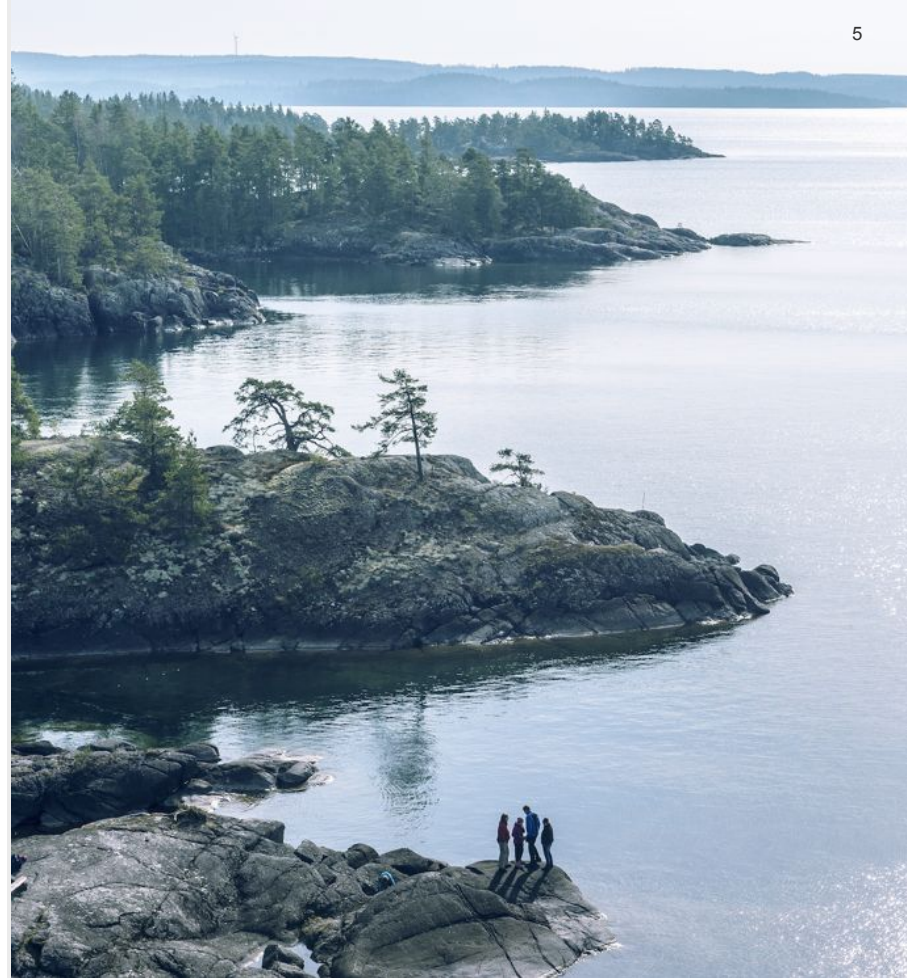
We care

- Lessons learned:
