



Background


A total of 246 validated shipping accidents happening in the Baltic Sea area were reported to the HELCOM in 2018. The share of pollution accidents was 5.6 %.





Background

Continuous risk management efforts and cooperation are required in order to prevent future maritime accidents and minimize their consequences.

Overview of PA Safe: Policy Area on Maritime Safety & Security

- To support maritime risk management and technological development of the shipping industry in the Baltic Sea
 EU countries
- In line with the EUSBSR overall objectives: save the sea, connect the region and increase prosperity
- The PA Safe was established in 2009, and has since become one of the key policy areas of the EUSBSR
- Throughout its history, the objective of PA Safe is for the Baltic Sea region to become a leading area for maritime safety and security
- The PA Safe has been very active to achieve these objectives, while contributing to the overall objectives of the EUSBSR
- The main tools for this purpose have been different types of projects and ongoing policy-dialogue involving multiple stakeholder groups
- PA Safe is coordinated by Denmark and Finland, and its work is funded through the EU Interreg BSR and coordinator countries
