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Role Models

Recent findings from the Facebook-OECD-World Bank Future of Business Survey (December 2018, covering 95 countries) reveal that, on average, close to half of all surveyed entrepreneurs had a role model when growing up. The significance of role models in the lives of entrepreneurs was clearly reflected in the honest discourse that took place during our session. Here are some of the key points we addressed while engaging with the conecot of role models on the day.

Here are the ways our panelists described what a role model was in their eyes.

Someone who you aspire to be like

Someone who can teach you something

Somebody who is realistic and realistically accessible

Someone who can show you a way of achieving something you may think is impossible yourself

Someone who can show you how to overcome struggle

Role models can show you a way forward that you may not have thought possible before or done in a way you may not have ever imagine.




They have the ability to take away the concern about if something can be done so you can focus on how it can be done

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Female Entrepreneurship

The ongoing efforts to encourage female entreprensurship is just as important today as it was in previous generations. The benefits of which are seen not only to the women who take on this lifestyle, but also to society as a whole and particularly to the young girls who aspire to be just like them. Women self employment and entrepreneurship allow them to gain confidence, self esteem and decision making experience leading to greater control over their lives in social, economic and political spheres (Kantor, 1999)



One survey with more than 1,000 participants shows that "twice as many women (26%) than men (14%) cited a lack of peer networks as a challenge to grow their business. For women who started their own business, 29% of women lacked peer mentorship versus just 14% of men." (JACQUELINE, 2020)

Multiple studies find a strong business case for investing in women entrepreneurs



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Peer Female Entrepreneur Networks

During our second panel discussion we focused on the relevance and impact of peer female entrepreneur networks, different models, best practice, and motivation for taking part in such networks. Here are the insights that we shared during the session, both in oral conversation and amongst audience members using the Zoom chat function.

From the research done by Helen Fullen 86% of people surveyed said that peer support was very important, that they liked to work in groups and peer support significantly reduces a sense of loneliness.

Here are some of the reasons why one might choose to get involved in a peer network:

- 1. Voluntary community based-resources
 - 2. Sponsorships from private business
 - 3. Membership fees
 - 4. State-funded/subsidised/directed

Tech tools to build your network




The various ways peer mentoring can be facilitated include:


Holding monthly events Having facilitators who genuinely facilitate Encouragement to simply invest your time in building your network Asking members to fill out surveys Bringing in people who have large and varied networks Automating as much as possible Enabling international connectivity in breakout rooms and zoom rooms Facilitating mentoring among the community Giving people the opportunity to showcase what they do Showcasing ways to build peer-to-peer connections Educating people how to coach each other Having a trusting culture of values and cultivate that sense of that peer-to-peer approach Cultivating a spirit of camaraderie Creating a sense of wellness at social events to allow people to develop personal relationships along the way

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
