
# Workbook for Assessing Risks and Planning Adaptation Part 1: Choosing an assessment level and type

### Assessment level

#### Choosing between Standard and Advanced Levels

Please choose between the two assessment levels Standard and Advanced. Starting with the Standard Level is recommended. Advanced Level assessments are generally for use by experienced users and/or for complex assessments. These assessment levels are described in more detail in chapter 2 of the Guidance.

(The risk management process also offers an Advanced Plus Level. This, however, is an add-on to the Advanced Level and does not need to be considered here.)
