In previous projects researchers from the Danube region have found that in their countries basic requirements for an optimal care of people with dementia are still lacking. Professional groups including general physicians, nurses, social workers, or occupational therapists have insufficient knowledge about dementia care. Moreover, the occupational groups involved are not interacting optimally. In many places facilities that are important for people with dementia such as day care centres, special care units in nursing homes or services such as meals on wheels are not available.

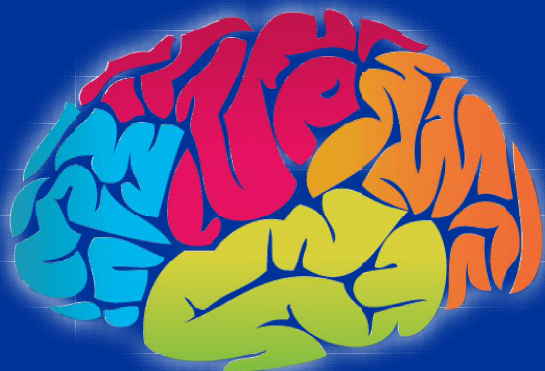
The objective of INDEED is to meet these deficits, and to support countries in the Danube region to implement national dementia strategies and to improve dementia care. The project targets institutions that have a role as multipliers, including bodies of professional education, ministries, professional boards, municipal administrations, charities, nursing home providers and social enterprises.

INDEED will develop three coherent modules targeting competences, cooperation and innovation potential. These modules will include interprofessional education, networking tools and business coaching. The project partners will elaborate traditional formats such as presentations, seminars or printed materials, but also an internet-based multimedia platform. Later in the project, the three modules will be tested in four countries in urban and rural areas and will be adapted to concrete local requirements and infrastructures in liaison with decision makers from ministries and public administrations.

The final intervention package will be made available to all interested institutions within and outside the Danube region.

This bi-annual newsletter offers regular updates on the progress and accomplishments of the INDEED project as well as on related topics about dementia care in the Danube region.

INTRODUCTION TO INDEED PROJECT



INDEED's main objective is to improve dementia care in the Danube region and to contribute to the implementation of national dementia strategies with the scope of enhancing the quality of life of people with dementia and their informal carers. The specific objectives are:

- To improve the knowledge and skills of professionals from different occupations involved in dementia care including health and social care, nursing, public administration;*
- To facilitate the cooperation of key actors and coordination of services;*
- To stimulate entrepreneurial activity and foster the development of dementia-related services and facilities on outpatient, intermediate and inpatient levels.*

1st INDEED PROJECT STAKEHOLDER SESSION IN CONJUNCTION WITH INDEED PROJECT | Kick-off Meeting



INDEED Project Partners, kick-off event 25-26 September 2018

The kick-off meeting of INDEED Project (Innovation for Dementia in Danube Region) took place on 25-26 September 2018 in Munich, Germany.

During the two days, all work package leaders presented their ideas and first results. During lively discussions, the focus was set to improve care services for early dementia. The event also offered a valuable opportunity to strengthen the exchange across work packages, enjoying a rich involvement, over 40 participants.

The first stakeholder session of INDEED took place also in Munich on the second day, September 26, 2018, in conjunction with the project's first general assembly meeting. Organised by the "Policy" work package (led by SZK), 15 participants attended, representing several institutions from the medical and care sector, public administrations, businesses, and charities. The purpose of the meeting was to assess the stakeholder's view on the current status of dementia care, unmet needs and educational preferences in order to ensure that the INDEED intervention package will

match the requirements of the future user group. Also, the stakeholders' role as multipliers and ambassadors of the INDEED intervention was emphasised.

INDEED - Improving dementia care in the Danube region

The conference thematically emphasised the need for interprofessional education to achieve person-centred dementia care. Thereby, participants discussed various aspects and came to an understanding that:

- There is an overlapping knowledge regarding dementia that all involved actors should be aware of
- Collaboration among different professions can be improved by fostering networking among all professions involved in dementia care
- Social entrepreneurship is an innovative approach to promote dementia care services in rural and urban regions

The consortium will keep deepening the contact to the stakeholder group to ensure user-friendly outputs.

With support from Štefanija Zlobec and David Krivec at Spomin·ica (Alzheimer Slovenija), and Zvezdan Pirtošek at the University of Ljubljana it was organised the first public event of the INDEED project as a satellite session within the 10th International Conference on Dementia (ASK 2018) at the Faculty of Medicine in Ljubljana. The conference was an excellent opportunity to present INDEED to a broader audience. Prof. Alexander Kurz, Project Coordinator, introduced the audience to INDEED. Starting from the framework of the Danube Transnational Programme, it's focus on mutual learning and cross-border cooperation, he presented the project's main objective of improving dementia care in the Danube region. The intervention package consists of three modules (CAMPUS, CONNECT, COACH) and will be delivered in a blended learning format. Also, he emphasised that the target groups for the INDEED intervention are institutions that are involved in dementia care. To evaluate the three modules and the blended learning concept, pilot actions will be held in 2020, starting in Slovenia.

Catalina Tudose, SRA President, being structured on three modules: "Knowledge, Collaboration and Development of Services for Appropriate Dementia Management" (Chairman: Assoc. Prof. PhD Psych. Raluca Sfetcu, Ph.D.), "Standards of Care for Residential Services" (Chairman: Assist. Prof. PhD Md. Mihai-Viorel Zamfir) and "The Patient Care with Dementia and the Role of Networking in Dementia Care Management with Applications in SRA Projects" (Chairman: PhD St. Psych. Ioana Caciula).

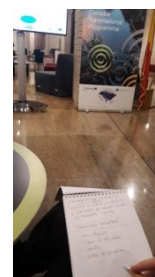

INDEED Project presentation | International Congress on Dementia-IcoDem 2018

The International Conference on Dementia in Sarajevo on 21-23 November 2018 brought together experts from Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Italy, Slovenia, Serbia and Germany to outline the current state of dementia research and care. Skillfully moderated by the chairman of the Conference Osman Kucuk who is the head of the INDEED partner Association AiR a broad array of relevant topics were discussed. The programme featured interprofessional, patient-centred and community-based care and non-pharmacological interventions. Key topics included dementia in neurological, cerebrovascular, cardiovascular and endocrine diseases; novel pharmacological treatments for Alzheimer's disease; timely diagnosis supported by biomarkers and brain imaging; risk factors and prevention of dementia; community-based services and dementia-friendly communities; non-pharmacological interventions including somatotherapy, music therapy and arts therapy, and palliative care. The INDEED project was presented at the meeting. With its comprehensive scope and focus on

practice the IcoDem/18 conference contributed to improving dementia care in Bosnia-Herzegovina and neighboring countries, and moved forward the development of national dementia plans.

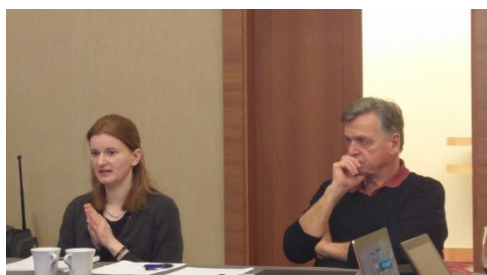
Zagreb Master Class on Dementia is one of the master classes in this field organized in the Balkan region with the aim to advance dementia care. The objectives of these **Dementia Master Classes** are to stimulate interprofessional exchange, increase the mutual knowledge and understanding, and strengthen the collaboration in practice. Therefore, the master classes gather a group of experts complemented by local representatives of different professions involved in dementia care (physicians, psychologists, nurses, pharmacists). The format of the workshops is interactive and aims to engage the target groups in workshops and roundtables on interprofessional management of dementia.

The Zagreb Master Class on Dementia gathered a group of experts of different professions involved in dementia care in the Danube region and other Balkan countries. The group of experts discussed common gaps in dementia care in the Danube region and other Balkan countries and solutions to approach these.

INDEED project could provide such solutions by increasing dementia competence in the Danube region.

Lea Pfäffel, INDEED Project Manager gave an outline of the INDEED project highlighting the pilot actions that are planned in Slovenia, Slovakia, Bulgaria and Romania. Zvezdan Pirtosek explained the workshops which are the key part of the pilot actions. On the first day, the workshops will focus on CAMPUS and CONNECT, on the second day the focus will be COACH. For CAMPUS, participants will be representatives of institutions, e. g. associations of physicians, nurses, occupational therapists and social workers. For CONNECT, participants will be representatives of health and social care providers, and patient organisations. For COACH, participants will be representatives of service providers, care facilities, start-ups and commercial

chambers. The workshops will be combined with / embedded in dementia action days which will be organised in conjunction with local patient and carer organisations.

Sarajevo statement on dementia

We are aware that the significant challenge associated with dementia is not only observed through the prism of a person suffering from dementia but also in relation to their caregivers. Moreover, the response to dementia needs to be comprehensive, systematic and interdisciplinary. Dementia not only represents a challenge for the health sector but also to society more generally.

Systematic support for people with dementia should be implemented through three linked approaches: **policy, service delivery** and **Information and research**.

We believe that it is necessary to develop dementia plans in all societies of the Western Balkan region.

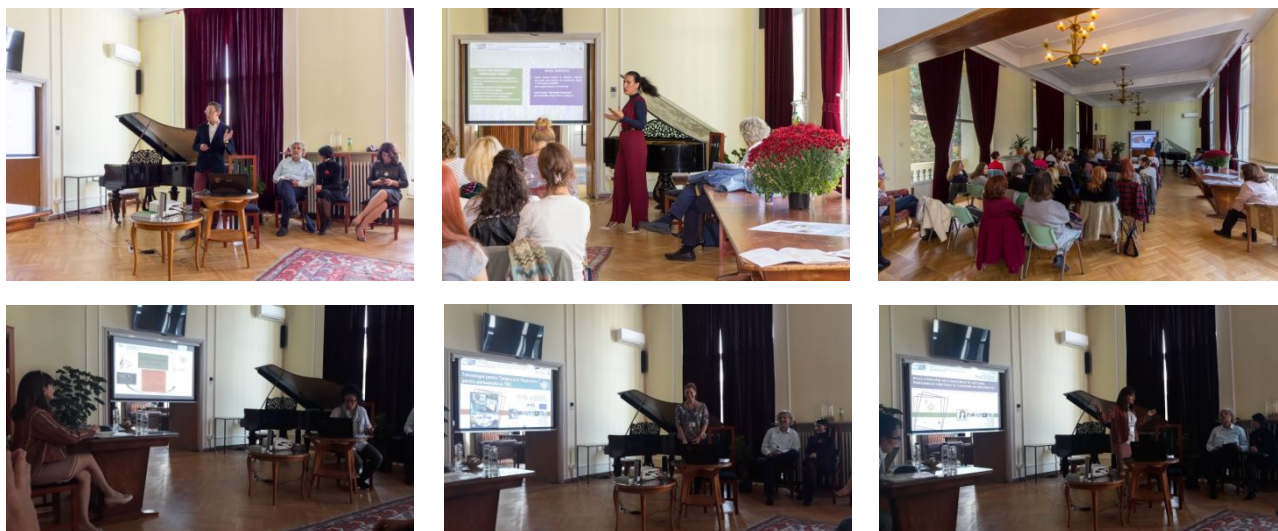

At the Alzheimer's Association International Conference (AAIC) on July 25 2018 the pharmaceutical company Eisai and Biogen announced presented the results of a placebo controlled clinical trial with the monoclonal antibody BAN2401 (Study 201; ClinicalTrials.gov identifier NCT01767311). BAN2401 stimulates the human immune system to remove the amyloid deposits which accumulate in the brain of people with Alzheimer's disease. The antibody treatment aims to slow down or even arrest the advancement of the disease, and thus the progression of symptoms, at the stage of prodromal or mild dementia. In the current trial which was in Phase II (at this point of drug development research primarily focuses on safety and optimal dosage) four different doses of the antibody were compared with an ineffective sham preparation (placebo). After 18 months of treatment, study participants who had received the highest dose showed a statistically significant reduction of the amount of amyloid in their brains (Figure 1; amyloid deposits can be visualised using a technology called positron emission tomography (PET)) and a slowing of symptom progression as compared to people who had received placebo (Figure 2). About 10 % of the participants exhibited a transient swelling of the brain, indicating an excessive

immune reaction. These results represent another limb in the chain of clinical studies that have yielded similar positive signals for other anti-amyloid antibodies such as aducanumab, crenezumab or gantenerumab. As a next step, researchers will attempt to demonstrate the efficacy and safety of the new antibody in larger trials which are required for the approval of the antibody as a drug. The evidence that is accumulating on anti-amyloid antibodies in Alzheimer's disease raises hope that in coming years a disease-slowing treatment may become available. People diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease who are interested in participating in a clinical trial are welcome to approach one of the trial sites.

The progressive impact of dementia on memory, communication, behaviour, orientation, and mood can have serious implications for an individual's wellbeing. Whilst there is currently no cure for dementia, it has been suggested that activity involvement can improve the quality of life for individuals living with the disease. Activities such as sensory stimulation and reminiscence therapy have been shown to have positive effects on mood, memory, and self-identity.

The project will create four SENSE-GARDENS in Belgium, Norway, Portugal and Romania, where images, videos, music and scents will strengthen the awareness of older people with dementia by providing stimuli to the different senses, such as sight, touch, hearing, balance and smell.

These SENSE-GARDENS are filled with familiar music, videos and photos from known places and with known people. Pictures and videos are combined with music - maybe a large image of mountains together with singing birds. Smells - for example the odour of a pine forest - are dispersed with a scent delivery system. This provides an immersive space automatically adjusted to each visitor, creating a connection to the most preserved areas of the memory.

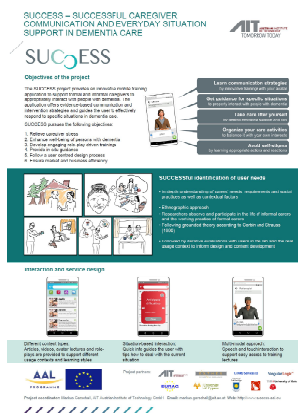
The SENSE-GARDEN will activate the persons with dementia both mentally and physically. They can for example cycle or walk in a well-known space and feel like they are going home. Such experiences may have an effect on invigorating their identity and helping recovering the sense of self.
