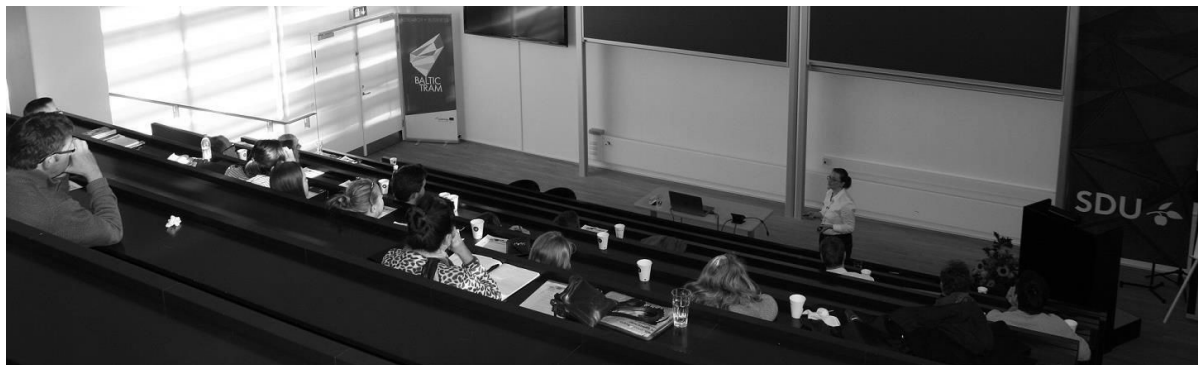

## Results of the 1st call for research services in the Baltic TRAM project

During the 1st call, which ran from May 1st to October 31st, a total of 24 applications for short-term research services were prepared and submitted. The largest number of the applications was sent in by Finnish companies (11), which accounts for 46% of all those
